Cherished family. Chosen family. Community. Where do we find support? Where do we find the connections we need so desperately? 1871 was an unkind time for an unmarried, divorced, or widowed woman. Jobs were near impossible to find, money was scarce, and the world had no use for a single 'older woman'. Very difficult choices sometimes had to made. Brothels afforded these women community, safety, and a little bit of money if they were lucky. If you didn't catch a deadly disease, get pregnant or fall victim to violence, you could find friendship, support and affection under these incredibly difficult circumstances. It was also in this community that a brothel would be taxed and produce enough money to fund the town's entire school system for the year. A 'house of joy' was a common term for a brothel, but looking more closely you see that real joy could exist. In the friendships they created, the jokes they shared and even the occasional fight, these women made their own families. Their chosen ones. As a companion piece to *Outlaw*, produced earlier this season, Jenny's House of Joy shows a vastly different yet incredibly important piece of history-the women of the wild west. What a pleasure to spend time with these women. It was my privilege. And thank you for coming back to the theatre, our chosen home. We are so happy to see you. Huge thanks to Emily, and Jamie, my fella Matthew, the incredible team at the Foster Festival, Seren, this glorious group of women who played with me in the hall and of course Canada's own, our Norm Foster.

An award winning actor, director, and teacher, with over thirty years' experience, Lisa had the pleasure of acting in the very first season of the Foster Festival as Vi in *Halfway There*. At last count she has performed in over twenty of Norm Foster's plays beginning with *Opening Night* at the Drayton Festival in 1997. Lisa has been seen on stages across Canada and is known for her performances with Mirvish Productions (*Come From Away, Les Miserables, The Wizard of Oz, Kinky Boots*), three seasons with the Stratford Festival, four seasons with the Shaw Festival as well Drayton Entertainment, RMTC, NAC, and Theatre Aquarius. As a teacher, Lisa has helped students and professionals find their voice and improve their audition technique for the past fifteen years. During the pandemic she trained as a personal support worker, and began to work in the community of Toronto.
